

Elements of SECAPs



- Status quo ("internal audit")
- Energy consumption and GHG emissions
- Vision and strategy
- Action plan
 - Description
 - Sectors
 - Responsibilities
 - Resources
 - Impacts
- Monitoring of implementation



























Learnings: Success factors

Own Your SECAP



- Political committment at all phases, not only on goals
- Integration into legal and administrative structure in the municipality
- Resources, resources, resources!
 - Qualified staff
 - Money
 - Time
 - Social capital and communication
- Committment of citicens and stakeholders
- Flexibility ("Living document")



























Selection of measures



- Select measures for all relevant sectors
- Consider climate mitigation, climate adaptation and fuel poverty (interactions and synergies)
- Look into your energy and GHG inventory (Results will mostly be the same ;-)
- Review other SECAPs and best practice examples
- Be a role model: municipality is the best sector to start!
- Start where you are, but start!

























Implementation of measures





- Internal communication of the SECAP
- Implementation should be integrated into existing processes and structures
- Tailor-made solutions, developed by the responsible administrative units
- Secure necessary resources (+ external funding)
- External communication of plans and implementation (success stories)
- Flexibility: adapt your actions where necessary



























Monitoring and reporting



- Develop simple to measure indicators for implementation actions and - sometimes more difficult - impacts
- Use tools for monitoring (and EnMS)
- Monitor and report regularly and adapt your plan based on the report
- Communication, communication, communication!

























Final thoughts



- Do the right things (important)
- Avoid the wrong things (much more important)
- >> A SECAP is not an additional instrument, it should cover and integrate ALL activities of the municipality (direct control) and its citicens (indirect control)
